I probably don't have to remind you of this, but last year, in the middle of Lent, we went into shutdown. You may remember a more typical Ash Wednesday service, and a few typical Lenten Sundays, and a couple of Lent studies, and then: the hard decision of halting in-person gatherings per public health guidelines.

We were navigating all the same choices at my church in California at that time, and looking back on the first few weeks of "quarantine" is a bit surreal. We all hoped we would be back in our sanctuaries by Easter, and that was certainly not the case. Sometime between that first decision to go to remote-only worship and virtual Holy Week, I remember reading this quote: This is the Lentiest Lent I ever Lent-ed.

Lent is the season of preparation and reflection before Easter, and it is traditionally marked by giving something up as a practice of focusing on God for the forty days (not counting Sundays) between Ash Wednesday and Easter. While other expressions of focus have emerged, especially in recent years, like practices of *adding* something like a daily devotional or prayer time instead of removing something like caffeine or desserts, Lent still has the reputation of a time when we abstain in some way from the comforts of this world so as to be more finely attuned to the comfort of Christ.

So, yes: last year was the Lentiest Lent we ever Lent-ed. We gave up so much more than we could have imagined, and even after Easter, we weren't able to return to worshipping in person, eating at restaurants, and hugging friends. In addition to requiring that we give up so much, that Lentiest Lent lasted for way longer than it had any right to!

How do we greet Lent this year? What's left for us to "give up"? And where could we possibly find the energy to give anything else up, after a year that has taken so much?

These are good questions that I invite us to dig into in the days ahead as we prepare for Ash Wednesday. If ever there was a year for considering practices of adding to observe Lent, perhaps it's this one! And hopefully we really do have the chance to add, as things are looking more and more promising for our careful return to in-person opportunities.


This gives us the chance to be intentional about our return, and perhaps *that* is what this Lent is about. Lent practices are always about noticing, that's why we often remove a habit (like caffeine or Facebook) to notice how that removal makes us feel and how he handle those feelings - do we take them to God? Do we sink into irritability? And either way, do we locate the grace that is present in everything?

How might we bring intention to what I *hope* is the most un-Lenty Lent we ever Lent-ed - a season of adding, of returning? How might we mark the many returns that are on the horizon with faith and gratitude?

I'm excited to explore this with you in the coming weeks. Among other things, we will have a Lenten study this year (details in this Streamer!), and I hope to talk with you there, and hopefully in person, about how you are finding opportunities for intention as we add back some of what was lost, but doing so in such a way we hold these worldly comforts in an increasingly God-honoring way.

Bank Draft

A Bank Draft is an easy way to give monthly. Many of our members have chosen this method. Several advantages include: no church weekly giving envelopes, no need to write checks, no handling by the Church Financial Secretaries & there are no fees. Please contact our bookkeeper Diane VanVleet at the church for assistance to set up a bank draft.

Online Giving

Through the website: willowcreekpc.org, click on the "Giving" or "Make a Donation" tabs and follow the instructions. This is a very simple method to give. There is a 2% fee per dollar amount on each transaction. On a gift of \$50 the fee would be \$1. If this is a recurring gift, and you would like to avoid the fees the church pays you may want to consider a bank draft.

Church Envelopes

This is a traditional method of giving. Church envelopes are generated for you and used to give weekly gifts. If you wish to receive or discontinue receiving a box of envelopes, please notify the church office.

Ash Wednesday February 17th Willow Creek Sanctuary

4pm - 6pm (drop-in)

Join us for this day of invitation into Lent.

Drop in anytime between 4pm and 6pm.

There will be "stations" set up around the sanctuary for individuals or households to explore Ash Wednesday and

prepare for Lent. These stations will include creative approaches to prayer and the safe imposition of ashes. These activities are designed with all ages in mind, and while many of them will be contemplative in nature, don't expect a silent sanctuary - we welcome the joy of children of all ages as we gather in our church on this holy day. Most people will spend an average of 30 minutes in the sanctuary.

We will practice all necessary safety precautions, including wearing masks in the building at all times, and maintaining social distance between households. We will honor public health limitations of how many folks can be in any space at any given time, and appreciate your patience if you have to wait your turn to head into the sanctuary (and we appreciate your awareness that others may be waiting for their turn, as you move through the stations).

You will enter the church at the doors by the offices and follow the guidance of volunteers for a one-way flow of traffic, then exit using the stairs and doors closest to the manse (or the elevator as needed).

We look forward to seeing you at church on Wednesday, February 17th from 4pm - 6pm.


The musical lineup looks like this for February:

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Carol for all of her hard work. She has always been right there for me. We will miss you, Carol.


January is almost over. I wonder what the groundhog will say? At least we are, at this point, not buried in snow.



Perhaps you've heard the word "covenant" before and wondered: "What does that even mean?" We might hear this word at a wedding or occasionally in Scripture readings, but it's not a word we usually use in our daily lives. It happens to come up a *lot* in the lectionary this Lent, so it seemed like a good opportunity to learn more about it together. We will explore the first covenants found in Scripture, what "covenant" means, and how ancient covenants continue to shape our faith today.

We will meet on Wednesday evenings in Lent (Feb. 24th - March 24th) at 6:30pm. If possible, we will meet in person in the Fellowship Hall (and offer a Zoom link for those who would rather participate that way).

Keep an eye on your updates email for whether or not we will be able to meet in person, or only on Zoom. This study is designed for adult learners.



Our Lenten devotionals this year are called "Where Your Heart Is".

Here is a note from the creator of the devotionals, Illustrated Ministry:

Our theme's inspiration comes from Jesus' teaching about storing treasures in his Sermon on the Mount. This Lent, we invite you to explore the many treasures you have in your life...By exploring Gospel passages about treasures and matters of the heart, we

invite you to wonder more deeply about what kinds of treasure matter, why we store treasures, and the power these treasures have in our lives.

We encourage you to explore how these ideas and themes influence how you view God, your faith, and the world. This Lenten devotional is written to be used individually or as a household, and is for all ages.


So grab a pen, some crayons or colored pencils, and start working through the devotional.
