Willow Creek Church Family,

Happy New Year! I greet 2021 with hope that our days of social distancing and remote worship are drawing to an end. I pray with you for efficacy of vaccines and for everyone's health and safety.

As I was researching for one of the hymns we learned about in our Advent study, *We Three Kings of Orient Are*, I discovered some things about the Epiphany of the Lord, which is traditionally celebrated on January 6th (or the preceding Sunday) and signifies the conclusion of the season of Christmas.

We Three Kings is considered an Advent hymn - Advent being the season of anticipation as we await Christ's birth. But this hymn is really the story of the magi visiting the Christ child and would not have happened on the night of the Nativity, but much later, perhaps even as late as Jesus being two-years-old! (Matthew 2:1-12) We particularly remember these wise royals and their journey of seeking when we observe Epiphany. Here is a description of Epiphany from our PCUSA Book of Common Worship:

"Epiphany" means manifestation or revelation. At the Epiphany of the Lord we celebrate the manifestation of God's saving purpose to all the nations of the world. Just as the magi came from a distant land to worship the Christ child, God's covenant of grace is extended to all people who believe the good news of Jesus Christ. The symbolism of light is important - not only because of the star that guided the magi, but as it suggests the bright dawning of God's self-revelation in Jesus Christ. As Christians, we are called to bear Christ's light in the world.

What a way to greet the new year, with hearts full of celebration for the covenant of grace God extends over all of creation.

My hope for all of us is that we find space within our hearts to hope not just for the end of the pandemic, but for the radical healing and reconciliation promised in Scripture. As I consider Epiphany's focus on manifestation and revelation, I wonder what God might be revealing to each of us, how God may be encouraging us to manifest God's love to others? In some ways, that's a lot to ask! To dig deep and find the energy and capacity not only for hope, but for action, to pray: "God I want to be a bearer of your light in all the world - what does that look like today?" It is a lot to ask, but it's not too much to ask, because with God all things are possible.

There is an old Epiphany practice of "chalking the doors", writing the letters CMB and the numbers of the current year, separated by crosses (+), over the doors of congregations and Christian homes: 20 + C + M + B + 21 or CMB + 2021. The letters CMB stand for the names of the magi (Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar) or the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat* (Christ bless this house).

I wonder if you have a piece of chalk at home, or can think of another way to observe this tradition? Here's a prayer from our *Book of Common Worship* to use as you find your own way to greet this new year:

God of doors and homes, bless this home this year and every year. Bless all who come and go through this door, both those who live here and those who visit. May all who enter through this door come in peace and bring joy. May all who come to this door find welcome and love. May the love and joy in this home overflow and spread into the community and the world. And may Jesus Christ watch over us all. Amen.

I will pray this prayer at the manse door and the doors of our beloved sanctuary. I pray it with the hope that many will cross both of those thresholds in this new year, and that they will be blessed, and that as you and I come and go through these doors, we too will bring the blessing of God's light to all whom we encounter.

New Year's Blessings to all of you! I can't wait to see what God does this year. We may not have chosen all of the circumstances of last year, but we can open our hearts and minds to see what we have learned, to see what we have been reminded to cherish, and to ask how we have been newly prepared to be bearers of God's light for all of creation.

WCPC Operating Statistics


