A *lot* of you have asked how we're enjoying our first northern Illinois winter. It is certainly the winteriest winter Scott and I have ever experienced, and very different from Oakland's typical 60 degrees.

But we have truly enjoyed it. The snow has been beautiful, and we haven't minded the cold. In fact, I much prefer the cold weather to summer's heat and humidity. As we've learned a little of what winter is like in our new home, I read a book that felt relevant: *Wintering*, by Katherine May. The author uses the winter season as a metaphor for how we can learn and grow during seasons of restriction and limitation, and how we can embrace the opportunity to hibernate, in a sense, as other animals do. I found her reflections particularly insightful as the end of this winter coincides with the end of some of our local pandemic restrictions.

It is no coincidence that these opportunities to emerge also happen as we continue our Lenten journey. It is no coincidence that the tentative beginning of spring coincides with the season of preparation for Christ's death and resurrection. Our landscape is currently marked by frosty white and will soon be grey and brown and then, one day, we'll awaken to the green of new growth. It happens every year and yet it is a relief every year - a breath of fresh spring air and sunshine as we emerge from our various winters and greet the promise of new beginnings once again.

There's something to be said for this annual occurrence that always feels new. It is connected to the promises of God that are always being made new. This Lent, we keep encountering Scripture about God's covenant promises, with our ancestors as well as us. These covenant passages remind us that the God's promises are always true, but newly engaged in different seasons in our own lives. A promise we read last year on March 1st will feel very different this year on March 1st - not because the promise has changed, but because *we* have changed.

I hope we find space in our eagerness to return to pause and consider how winter - the season, and the long winter of pandemic - has changed us. One of the best ways I know to cultivate space for noticing is by lingering over Scripture, particularly when we return to familiar passages, like many of the Lenten passages this year. When we read something we thought was familiar and encounter in it new revelation, it is a chance to see how we have grown.

This is my hope and prayer for each of us - that we will allow the fullness of all that has happened to shape who we are as individuals and as a church. Some things about Willow Creek will always remain the same - that we are and always have been a beacon of light to this community. And yet, to be a beacon now means something different than it did 175 years ago. The core truth remains, but there is space for us to reimagine *how* to shine brightly here and now. As we ask God to show us how to be Christlike neighbors, we might hear God telling us to start with noticing who we have become throughout winter, before moving to the springtime actions of planting and cultivating our hopes.

Pastor Lauren and Scott are expecting their first baby on April 10th!


The Finance/Personnel/Endowments Committee and the Session discussed Pastor Lauren's parental leave during the month of February. We were guided by Blackhawk Presbytery's Family Leave Policy which was included in Pastor Lauren's Terms of Call.

Pastor Lauren will have **8 weeks** of full maternity leave, **tentatively beginning April 10th**. During those 8 weeks of full leave, Pastor Lauren will be unavailable for any church business she will not preach or lead worship, she will not attend meetings, she will be unavailable for pastoral care, etc. Then, Pastor Lauren will use accrued vacation to have **4 weeks of part-time leave**. During these 4 weeks, she will preach and be available for all pastoral care needs.

During those first 8 weeks of full leave, we will welcome a familiar face and voice back to our pulpit! **Pastor David Jones** has agreed to preach, moderate Session and be available for pastoral care emergencies during the 8 weeks of full leave. We anticipate welcoming Pastor Dave on Sunday, April 11th (but he is available to start earlier if that becomes necessary).

While we are all excited about Baby Betzel, as well as excited that many of the pandemic restrictions are lessening, there is still a great deal of uncertainty around the coronavirus and newborns. We ask that the Betzel Family's need for privacy as well as their need to practice the utmost caution be honored during these first few months. We will have many years to get to know this new addition to our Willow Creek family, and appreciate everyone's patience.

Did you know we have a temporary **Labyrinth** in our Fellowship Hall? While we are working very hard to honor all public health guidelines, and cannot have regular fellowship at this time, you *are* invited to take a few moments to talk with labyrinth anytime you're in the building. It will be available for at least a few more weeks.

A labyrinth has a clear path in and out, which makes it different from a maze. In the Middle Ages, labyrinths were used as a way for people to participate in a pilgrimage without the expense or time required in actually going to another place. Labyrinths were created on the floors of cathedrals to help draw people into meditation.

The path of the labyrinth will become clear as you walk. Traditionally, a labyrinth walk is done in silence.

This is a two-way path, and everyone has their own speed. You might meet others along your way. We simply request that you keep silence and don't demand the attention of anyone you pass - each individual is on their own personal prayer journey.

(Silence can be hard for people of all ages! But I encourage you to take on the challenge. Notice what happens if you do this walk all by yourself, without talking about it. *If* no one else is around and you want to run the labyrinth or approach it more playfully - go for it! Just be mindful of others.)

Bank Draft

A Bank Draft is an easy way to give monthly. Many of our members have chosen this method. Several advantages include: no church weekly giving envelopes, no need to write checks, no handling by the Church Financial Secretaries & there are no fees. Please contact our bookkeeper Diane VanVleet at the church for assistance to set up a bank draft.

Online Giving

Through the website: willowcreekpc.org, click on the "Giving" or "Make a Donation" tabs and follow the instructions. This is a very simple method to give. There is a 2% fee per dollar amount on each transaction. On a gift of \$50 the fee would be \$1. If this is a recurring gift, and you would like to avoid the fees the church pays you may want to consider a bank draft.

Church Envelopes

This is a traditional method of giving. Church envelopes are generated for you and used to give weekly gifts. If you wish to receive or discontinue receiving a box of envelopes, please notify the church office.



Hello Willow Creek Friends, I am so pleased that we will be meeting in person again. Even though there will be restrictions, we will still be able to worship together.



Perhaps you've heard the word "covenant" before and wondered: "What does that even mean?" We might hear this word at a wedding or occasionally in Scripture readings, but it's not a word we usually use in our daily lives. It happens to come up a *lot* in the lectionary this Lent, so it seemed like a good opportunity to learn more about it together. We will explore the first covenants found in Scripture, what "covenant" means, and how ancient covenants continue to shape our faith today.

We will meet on Wednesday evenings in Lent (Through March 24th) at 6:30pm. If possible, we will meet in person in the Fellowship Hall (and offer a Zoom link for those who would rather participate that way).

So grab a pen, some crayons or colored pencils, and start working through the devotional."
