A FINAL REFLECTION

It was a great pleasure subbing for Pastor Lauren during her maternity leave. I enjoyed developing a series of messages about the role God's love plays in the lives of God's children as I shared some of my personal story.

One story I didn't share is about my daughter who now works for the Northern Illinois Food Bank and her comment that surprised me years ago when – as a teenager – she declared her favorite parable begins:

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, "

"Although she doesn't remember saying it I remember it well. I think it is because she would attend worship in those days and read a book during my sermon. I didn't chastise her for it, but I was doubly impressed that one sermon I gave on Matthew 25 must have gotten through to her. Her commitment as a fund raiser for the CROP Hunger Walk organization and now for Northern Illinois Food Bank suggests all the more that I am right about that.

Unlike so many of Jesus' parables that can be found in at least two or more of the four gospels the parable of the sheep and the goats is found only in Matthew. This helps make naming our national church program after it a logical decision. Although chapter 25 has several other parables as well, Matthew 25 has become synonymous with the Jesus saying:

"For as much as you have done it to the least of these you have done it to me."

One thing that has recently struck me is this. When the sheep were informed they had helped Jesus, their risen Lord, they were surprised.

"Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? 38 And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? 39 And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?"

It appears the righteous sheep didn't need awareness that they were helping their savior. They were simply helping out of their compassion for anyone less fortunate than themselves.

It is my understanding that the call to become a Matthew 25 Church includes the effort to convince all Presbyterians that everyone, even those who have made bad choices in their lives, are worthy of our help. Your web site makes it clear that Willow Creek Presbyterian Church understands this. As I pointed out in my Pentecost sermon your web site – 'Our Missions' page under the 'About Us' tab – sites Matthew 25 and continues:

"Mission and outreach are a huge part of who we are at Willow Creek Presbyterian Church. We believe that serving one another is serving God. You'll notice that we serve not only those around us, but those among us. If you are in need, please contact us."

Clearly, Willow Creek Presbyterians are not surprised to know all that they do for others has, in fact, been helping our Savior. Were your church to become an official Matthew 25 Congregation you would simply be announcing this to everyone else.

Hybrid Worship

We have returned to hybrid worship! Our local public health guidance allows for 50 folks in our sanctuary, and so if you feel comfortable, you are welcome to join us in person for worship on Sunday mornings at 10am. You are also welcome to continue worshipping virtually on Facebook live, YouTube or our church website.

Per current public health guidelines, we will wear masks in the building at all times, practice social distancing between households, and we will not be able to sing or recite together. Our hope is that these restrictions are temporary.

If you do choose to join us for worship in person, we ask that you sign our updated WCPC Covid-19 Waiver.

As updates happen to the Phase 4 public health guidelines, Session is doing its best to adapt our own protocol. The newest update says that a fully vaccinated individual (including the two week waiting period) does not 'count' in the total limit of having 50 people gathered in one space. That being said, if you have been fully vaccinated and are willing to share that info with us, we can then welcome more people into our sanctuary. If being fully vaccinated and willing to share applies to you, then we ask that show your vaccine card to the host on Sunday

morning (the hosts are the ones receiving waivers at the little table on the stairs). They will put a check by your name that you are fully vaccinated and will then know that you should not be counted in the total of 50. You only have to show your card once - we'll keep record of it. Please know that this is 100% voluntary and we will not ask for your card. Simply show it if you are willing. Please let us know if you have any questions!

**We are grateful that the covid situation continues to improve, as evidenced by the CDC announcing new guidelines for folks who are fully vaccinated. We look forward to discussing these new guidelines, as well as the policies from our local government, at our next Session meeting on June 8th. For now, we will continue to follow our current policies for worshipping in person (wearing masks, practicing social distance between households, etc.). **

Bank Draft

A Bank Draft is an easy way to give monthly. Many of our members have chosen this method. Several advantages include: no church weekly giving envelopes, no need to write checks, no handling by the Church Financial Secretaries & there are no fees. Please contact our bookkeeper Diane VanVleet at the church for assistance to set up a bank draft.

Online Giving

Through the website: willowcreekpc.org, click on the "Giving" or "Make a Donation" tabs and follow the instructions. This is a very simple method to give. There is a 2% fee per dollar amount on each transaction. On a gift of \$50 the fee would be \$1. If this is a recurring gift, and you would like to avoid the fees the church pays you may want to consider a bank draft.

Church Envelopes

This is a traditional method of giving. Church envelopes are generated for you and used to give weekly gifts. If you wish to receive or discontinue receiving a box of envelopes, please notify the church office.
