#### "A Faith Community, Growing Together, Sharing the Love of Christ"

August finds us in the midst of a sermon series on Ephesians.

I typically follow the Revised Common Lectionary, a schedule of scripture readings that follow a three year cycle. There are designated readings for every Sunday - one from the Psalms, one from another part of the Old Testament, a Gospel passage, and another New Testament passage.

One of the reasons we follow the lectionary is because at the end of each three year cycle, if we've read *every* lectionary text, we'll have heard nearly the entire Bible, receiving a consistent and broad exposure to all of God's Word.

Of course, we don't always read every passage! You might notice that most weeks there's a scripture reference next to the Call to Worship and Assurance of Pardon. I do my very best to get these from the Lectionary Readings, so that we'll hear as much Scripture as possible.

Even so, we can't make it to every verse. So when I noticed that for several weeks the New Testament readings were long passages from the book of Ephesians, I wondered what it might be like if we read every word of Ephesians together in worship.

Preaching on Ephesians is interesting because the book itself is like a sermon. It is believed that the writer wasn't the Apostle Paul, but a student of his. The person who wrote this letter carefully studied Paul's writings, and then wrote their own version of Pauline theology. The letter is addressed to the "saints who are at Ephesus" but even that is vague - there were probably several churches in Ephesus, a bustling, cosmopolitan city. With origins that are so open to interpretation, we're left to conclude that this is a letter from any beloved child of God to any church. Certainly it is a letter for us here and now.

It's a letter that bounces back and forth between describing the life of individual discipleship and how our individual discipleship gives shape to our communal life. It's a letter full of praise for the divine gift of grace - indeed, again and again the letter writer seems overwhelmed with gratitude for the goodness of God, and eager beyond description to invite others to be just as joyously overwhelmed.

There is much wisdom and many lovely quotes in Ephesians: "For it is by grace you have been saved!" "God is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we can ask or imagine!"

The gifts of this letter are too vast to be preached on in just seven Sundays. My hope is that these summer sermons highlight some of Ephesians, but that you also hear things in the Scripture readings that intrigue you and invite you to come back and read the letter on your own.

And I am always curious to know what resonates with you and what interests you. Do you enjoy sermons on the epistles (the New Testament letters like Ephesians), or the Gospels, or do you tend to be more captivated learning about the Old Testament? Are there parts of Scripture you've never heard sermons on that you're curious about? As I continue to get to know you and as I plan for fall and then Advent, I'd love to learn more about what parts of the Bible most intrigue you.

#### Argyle Preschool Update!

As many of you know, Stephanie Konen, our Preschool Director/Teacher informed us last spring that she would not be returing for the 2021-2022 school year. She has been generously helping us renew our Preschool license by navigating all the criteria and paperwork that DCFS requires.

In the meantime we began advertising the Preschool/Director/Teacher on the indeed.com website. We vetted two well qualified individuals and were excited about their interviews. The first candidate we offered the job to accepted and then had to resign due to personal circumstances and life changes. We then offered the job to our second candidate, she accepted and also resigned shortly after due to family circumstances and life changes. We have since readvertised the position and have not received any interest and inquires from any possible candidates.



We then contacted families who had expressed an interest in our program this past spring and summer, but because of the uncertainty of whether our school would be open in the fall, they chose to sign their children up for other programs.

So it is with sadness and disappointment that our committee decided that Argyle Preschool will not open this fall. We will continue to work on securing a Director/Teacher with the hopes of filling the position so that we can open for the 2022-2023 school year.

## Save the Date! Church "Spring" Clean in the Fall! Saturday, September 11th 8am 'til the work is done!



#### Rose Window Repairs & Funding

We are excited and grateful that the lower petal of our beloved Rose Window is being repaired and will return sometime in the next few months. The glass as well as the wood surrounding the lower panel are being repaired.

I am so grateful that the generosity of this church along with wise stewardship has enabled us to make this important repair.

Knowing a repair was on the horizon, your Finance/Personnel/Endowments Committee and Session made a withdrawal from the endowment fund in November 2019. That withdrawal was for \$30,000. Our practice is for one third of each endowment withdrawal to go to Mission, one third to Building Repair, and one third to Capital Improvement. That means that \$20,000 (Building Repair and Capital Improvement) was set aside for the Rose Window project.

Due to Covid, it was several months before Building & Grounds was able to select a company to do this work. The actual project started this past June with the removal of the petal.

The estimated cost of the project is a little less than \$30,000, so it is largely covered by the \$20,000 from the November 2019 Endowment Withdrawal.

Session has decided to fund the remainder of the cost through **Memorial Funds** and through **gifts** from the congregation.

Would you like your loved one's memorial funds to be used for this project? If so, let me or the church office know. We will have a plaque made indicating whose funds were used for the window.

Would you like to give to this project? We are setting a fundraising goal of \$500 from the congregation. We have already received some gifts and are well on our way to meeting this goal. We would like to collect all of these gifts by September 19th, which is Kirkin' o' the Tartans. If you would like to give a special gift to the rose window, simply indicate that on the memo line of your check.

Thank you for your support for this important repair! Our church building is a landmark in our community - not just for us who love it so much, but for the many folks who drive past it every day. While the building itself is not the most important part of our church, the way we care for what God has entrusted to us sends a message about who we are as a congregation. Caring well for this historic structure shows our community that we are rooted in tradition while also attentive to the needs of the present, and able to prepare for the future.
