Advent is here! Here are some of the scriptures included in the lectionary readings this year:

Psalm 25:6 "Be mindful of your mercy, O LORD, and of your steadfast love, for they have been from of old."

Malachi 3:4 "Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the LORD as in the **days of old** and as in former years."


Luke 1:70-71 "...as he spoke through the mouth of his holy prophets **from of old**, that we would be saved from our enemies..."

Then there are several prophetic verses that encourage with reminders that the promises from of old will come true "on that day" - a day in the future we look forward to.

I won't be able to preach on all of these verses, but as I read these and the other scheduled passages, this theme emerged for me: *Days of Old*. Again and again the idea that something old and ancient is still true, or the idea that a long-awaited promise is coming true, emerged from the page.

As I think about this theme, I'm struck that this is a year where we might feel particularly nostalgic. We get to return to old traditions we missed last year. There will be many sweet moments of return. And there will also be moments of continued longing - either because of loved ones we have lost since the last time we cherished a particular tradition, or because the return doesn't feel the way we expect it to.

This isn't only because of COVID - Advent and Christmas have always offered this complicated cocktail of emotions! Advent is a season of waiting and expectation and hope and then it's over. Christmas day arrives and many wishes come true, but some don't. Christmas day arrives and the thing we most wished for is sitting under the tree, but the experience of that gift never matches expectations.



This reminds me of a favorite quote from C.S. Lewis, "If I find in myself a desire which no experience in this world can satisfy, the most probable explanation is that I was made for another world." While this world offers many good things, many sweet blessings that are a foretaste of glory divine, we weren't made for this world, but the next. Advent reveals this. This is the perfect season to pay attention to our longings, to pay attention to the blessings in this life that bring us comfort and peace in the longing, and to notice what we still long for - divine love and the return of Christ.

I am excited to explore this theme with you in the coming weeks as we continue to return to traditions and create new memories together.


