I am grateful beyond words for the joy we shared on October 17th as I was installed as your Pastor and Emmett was baptized. Installations begin with this litany which is based on 1 Corinthians 12:4 - 11:

There are a variety of gifts, but it is the same Spirit who gives them.

There are different ways of serving God, but it is the same Lord who is served.

God works through each person in a unique way, but it is God's purpose that is accomplished.

To each is given a gift of the Spirit to be used for the common good.

Together we are the body of Christ, and individually members of it.

I love these reminders - that *together* we are the body of Christ. We are each unique and necessary, and God is most clearly seen and experienced when we come together as our whole, authentic selves.

These verses perfectly describe how important each of us is to the body of Christ, which is a central focus for us, especially during stewardship season. God's redeeming work in the world requires that we all participate - it's just as ridiculous to imagine a hand or foot acting on its own as it is to imagine a Christian trying to seek and serve God on their own. We need one another, and our greater community needs us to be unified in purpose and love in order to see how Christ is reflected here at Willow Creek.

This stewardship season, I hope you will find time to pray about what role God is calling you to play in the upcoming year. Perhaps you will continue to do the same role you have done for many years - that is good and appreciated! Or perhaps God is calling you to serve and seek in new ways.

On Installation Sunday we had the chance to reflect on this past year while also looking toward the future. In her charge to me, Marie mentioned my very first communication with the PNC. I remember how excited I was to talk to a church that described itself this way: "Our history has molded us, our love binds us, and our desire to fulfill God's calling motivates us."

Amen! We are molded by a wonderful history here at Willow Creek, a history of generosity and faithfulness. Our love for Christ and one another does indeed bind us - and, we can always seek to be more loving. Our desire to fulfill God's calling does motivate us, and this is a season of seeking God for clarity and energy in that motivation.

How can we more fully fulfill all that God is calling us to be at Willow Creek? And what is the individual role God is calling you to play in that, as we come together to seek God and serve God's children?



Bank Draft

A Bank Draft is an easy way to give monthly. Many of our members have chosen this method. Several advantages include: no church weekly giving envelopes, no need to write checks, no handling by the Church Financial Secretaries & there are no fees. Please contact our bookkeeper Diane Van Vleet at the church for assistance to set up a bank draft.

Online Giving

Through the website: willowcreekpc.org, click on the "Giving" or "Make a Donation" tabs and follow the instructions. This is a very simple method to give. There is a 2% fee per dollar amount on each transaction. On a gift of \$50 the fee would be \$1. If this is a recurring gift, and you would like to avoid the fees the church pays you may want to consider a bank draft.

Church Envelopes

This is a traditional method of giving. Church envelopes are generated for you and used to give weekly gifts. If you wish to receive or discontinue receiving a box of envelopes, please notify the church office.

Ham Balls Recipe – Recipe by Mrs. Carol Norem & from the 1956 Women's Auxiliary WCPC Cookbook

- 1 lb ground lean smoked ham
- 1-1/2 lb ground lean pork
- 2 cups bread crumbs
- 2 beaten eggs
- 1 cup milk

Make into balls, mix 1/2 cup water, 1 cup brown sugar, 1 teaspoon dry mustard and 1/2 cup vinegar to make sauce to pour over. Place in a shallow pan and bake 1 hour or more. Baste occasionally.

Book Club


Join us for a book club discussion!


