Dear Willow Creek Church Family,

Happy 2022! I was looking back at last year's January Streamer, and I noticed that I started out with a hope that "our days of social distancing and remote worship are coming to an end."

Well, sort of? What's really different between this New Year's and last? And what's really still the same?

Years ago, I traveled to Turkey with a friend and we visited a bazaar where she found the perfect gift for her three nieces, adorable little dolls in traditional dress. She wanted to give them each the same doll, and we looked and looked and finally found two that were identical, but could not find a third one. The seller of the dolls was eager for us to buy, and kept offering different alternatives, holding out the two identical dolls and a third one that didn't match, saying: "See? Same!"

And we would laugh and shake our heads and say: "No, this one is different."

He just shrugged, and pointing at each doll, said: "Same, same, different. All the same!"

She finally decided to get her nieces three different dolls, but for years afterward that phrase would come back to us; "Same, same, different." It was surprisingly useful - whether regarding situations we faced as teachers, or other aspects of our lives. We would encounter a student who posed really similar challenges to a student from the previous year, and we would sigh and say: "Same, same, different." It became shorthand for remembering, as Scripture says, that there is "nothing new under the sun," and for remembering that whatever challenges we thought were external often returned in a slightly different form to show us we actually had a lot to learn about ourselves.

Same, same, different is how I feel as we face another year whose beginning is marked by some covid uncertainty. There is *much* that is different, of course! I rejoice that we got to have our traditional Christmas Eve service, and sing together as we lit candles and contemplated the holiest of nights. I rejoice at the comfort many of us have found in vaccines. I rejoice that many of us were able to celebrate the season with loved ones. There is much that is different, and I am grateful for the many blessings and returns we experienced in 2021.

And yet - there is much that is the same. The headlines feel a little too familiar, which just adds to the confusion - is this the same threat as before? Or is it different? Is is *substantially* different? How worried should I be?

And that is what feels the same - the uncertainty.

This is also the same: our endlessly loving, eternal, sovereign God. We mark time by hours, days, weeks, months, years - and so, this turning of the calendar feels like a moment when things should be markedly different.

But for God, a day is like a thousand years. That does not bring me great comfort when I feel impatient! But if I can manage to take a few deep breaths and consider the vastness of God, if I can try to make sense of eternity, I am comforted to remember that none of these uncertainties are uncertain for God - God has not been surprised at a single turn in this pandemic.

Meanwhile, I think back to how my friend and I used, "same, same, different," to remember that new versions of old challenges often arose so that we could learn more about ourselves, so that we could grow. I am *trying* to bring that attitude to the things that feel the same this New Year. While rejoicing about what is *not* the same, as I consider the things that feel the same, what might I have to learn this time, as an experience that is just a little different elicits the same response in me? What is God teaching me this time?
