Per Capita

Every church in our denomination pays a set amount of money per member to the PC(USA). This money supports the functions and missions of the larger church, including funding salaries for folks who work at the Presbytery. Willow Creek especially experienced the support of those Presbytery staff members when we were seeking a new pastor. These funds provide support and training for our pastor and countless resources for the whole denomination.

This set amount of money is called *per capita*. If you use the giving envelopes, you may have noticed this on the sticker: "Per capita \$40.00 per member." That's the amount that has been set this year. For the past few years, Willow Creek Presbyterian Church has not been able to meet its per capita responsibilities to Blackhawk Presbytery.

Our Session has decided that this year, Willow Creek Presbyterian Church will make quarterly payments of our church's per capita responsibility to Blackhawk Presbytery. Our per capita responsibility as a congregation is \$4,440.00 for 2022, based on the number of members from 2020. If you wish to contribute to the church's per capita payment by paying your part (\$40 per member), you can mail to the church office or place it in the collection plate labeled as per capita. Once we receive your contribution we will send it to Blackhawk Presbytery.

Change for Change Sunday

Each Second Sunday of the month will be **"Change for Change Sunday"**. We have pledged to raise our children in the faith. The children have taken the lead in this mission project. They have given us the opportunity to show, surround and saturate them in the Gospel value of generosity.
