## A Faith Community, Growing Together, Sharing the Love of Christ

Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

This is our refrain as Easter people. This is our prayer - that we might believe in the truth of resurrection.

This Eastertide we will consider the reality of resurrection through the Acts of the Apostles. For the next few weeks, we will read lectionary stories that describe what happened after Jesus rose from the dead. How did people encounter the risen Christ? What miracles occurred? What changed? How did this unbelievable story spread and impact the whole world?

Throughout this season, our paraments in the sanctuary remain white - the color of resurrection. We also use white paraments on Communion Sundays - when we eat this bread and drink this cup to proclaim the saving death or our Risen Lord until Christ comes again - and Christ will come again! And, we use white paraments when celebrating Baptisms, symbolizing the new life we have because Christ is risen. White paraments are also used at weddings, indicating a new family being formed rooted in the covenant of God's love. Finally, we use white paraments at funerals, when we often read these verses from Romans 6:

When we were baptized into Christ Jesus, we were baptized into his death. We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that, as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of God, we too might live a new life. For if we have been united with Christ into a death like his, we will certainly be united with Christ in a resurrection like his.

This is what we believe - that we will **certainly** be united with Christ in a resurrection like his.

This is the belief that gives us hope and empowers us to live in hope - to live as though this world is not all there is, as though there is resurrection and reunion promised to us, as though we are not merely our work and our stuff but something more.

As we consider the word of the Lord from the book of Acts in this season of white paraments, my prayer is that all of our hearts will be open to the otherworldly hope that is ours in Christ Jesus - what new things might we dare to hope for? In what new ways is God calling us to share heavenly hope with others? How is God speaking to us about the reality of resurrection?

May we have a Blessed Eastertide! Alleluia!

May 15. . . Dan Holmes, one of our favorites and always special.




May 22. . . Elizabeth O'Leary, Piano



#### Gardens, Like Churches, Need Infrastructure – "Understanding per capita"

For many years, we had simply planted bulbs, tended vegetables and weeded flower beds. It was only when we had to start the garden from scratch that we became aware of how a healthy garden depends on infrastructure. We had never been particularly concerned with soil composition and drainage. We assumed and took for granted that the garden would be there year after year.

Congregations can be like that. We worship, teach Sunday school, and sing in the choir. We marry and bury. We advocate for justice. However, without the support that undergirds the way we do church, the plants in our congregational gardens would find it difficult to thrive. We are not often aware of the value of per capita, but it is there all the time — especially when we need it!

#### **Session Summary**

Session met on Tuesday, April 5, 2022 for the monthly discussion. Several decisions were made during this discussion, including approval of relaxation of restrictions due to COVID (returning Coffee & Fellowship after worship services); approval of a school for piping (and potentially drumming) to meet at WCPC and allow regular use of the facility to CoRPB (City of Rockford Pipe Band); and Rise Against Hunger approved to occur November 20, 2022 in concert with our Hamball Dinner.

March was an average month for giving. Our expenses were up in March due to the cooler weather. We are in the red about \$7,000. so far this year. We expect that to decrease as expenses reduce throughout the year and consistent giving continues.


