Summary of the 225th General Assembly

Every two years, commissioners elected by their presbyteries (half ruling elders, half teaching elders) meet to



conduct the business of our denomination. General Assembly (GA) is responsible for assuring that the expression of our theology remains true to the biblical standards in our historic confessions as it presents a witness for truth and justice in our community and in the world, setting priorities and establishing relationships within and beyond the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

This summer was the first-ever hybrid assembly, with in-person committee meetings in Louisville and plenary sessions online via Zoom. Here are some of the things the Assembly prayerfully discerned, with decisions that equip and enable various entities of the church to live into their missional calling along with proposed changes to our Constitution (specifically Part 2: The Book of Order) which presbyteries will vote on to ratify in the coming year.

• Elected co-moderators Revs. Ruth Santana-Grace and Shavon Starling-Louis, who stood for election using the theme "Unbounded We Thrive"

- Approved the "Litany of Repentance" offering an apology to African Americans for the sin of slavery and its legacy and recommitting to confronting White supremacy within the church and world.
- Condemned violence against Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, disparities experienced by Black women and girls, and racial disparities in healthcare.
- Formed a committee to write a new confession for consideration by future assemblies and the denomination.
- Renewed commitment to ending gun violence by declaring 2022-2032 a "Decade to End Gun Violence" and asking Presbyterian Mission Agency to develop tools for faith-based advocacy and study.
- Proposed a constitutional amendment to the Book of Order recommending at least 12 weeks of paid family leave be included in all ministers' terms of call.
- Approved a resolution of "Recognition that Israel's Laws, Policies and Practices Constitute Apartheid Against the Palestinian People."
- Approved committee to oversee the unification of the Office of the General Assembly (OGA) and the Presbyterian Mission Agency (PMA) into a single agency to better facilitate the work of the denomination.
- Directed PC(USA) entities to divest from five oil and gas companies who GA concluded are not moving quickly enough to try to slow global warming.

As you can see, many of the topics the Assembly engaged are complex. In a denomination of over a million people, there will be a lot of different opinions on some of these decisions. This is one of my favorite things about our denomination. I had the privilege of participating in GA in 2016. It was a humbling experience to witness working together, seeking to glorify God *not* in the perfection of outcomes but in the holiness of breaking bread with people on opposite sides of every overture. Our unity is not in our ability to merely agree, but our ability to unflinchingly disagree, while remembering that we are sisters and brothers in Christ.

If you have interest in learning more about any of the conclusions from GA, let me know and we'll explore them together.

The next General Assembly will be held in 2024 with online committee meetings and in-person plenary sessions in St. Lake City, Utah.

Banner Tutorial for Kirkin' o' the Tartans

Below are instructions for creating a banner for the Willow Creek Presbyterian Church of Argyle Kirkin' o' the Tartans worship service:

1. Procure solid or tartan fabric. You will need roughly 17"x27". Three sides of a brown paper shopping bag can be used as a rough template.



- 2. Fold both sides in approximately 1" to obtain a finished width of 15". Sew sides or use iron-on hem tape.
- 3. Fold top down approximately 2" to obtain finished height of 25". Sew or use iron-on hem tape. The dowel rod used to hang the banner will fit through this slot.



4. Fold in triangles at bottom till they meet. Sew or use iron-on hem tape.



5. Add family crest, family name, family photo, or any other appropriate decoration to individualize your banner.
