Dear Willow Creek Church Family,

I was overjoyed on Sunday, November 20th, at our annual hamball potluck. It's worth remembering that we kept this tradition going *even* during Covid, thanks to some creative leaders who figured out how to make hamballs happen as a drive through! If ever there was a beloved tradition, it's this potluck.

Even so, you were willing to try something new which changed our experience of a favorite tradition. The Session discussed at length whether or not we should mess with the potluck, however there wasn't another good date for the Rise Against Hunger service project (think of how full our December Sundays get!) and we decided this congregation would feel that serving others is a worthy enough reason to let a tradition evolve.

I say you were willing, but I guess I don't know that for sure. Maybe you were hesitant to jump in on the meal packing. Maybe you were irritated, even a little hangry, having to work before enjoying one of your favorite meals of the year. All of those feelings are more than ok! Most of us do not find change, especially change to a beloved tradition, easy. But regardless of how you actually felt, you got to work! Side by side, we scooped, packed, weighed and sealed 10,584 meals! These meals will be sent around the world to folks suffering hunger for any number of reasons (famine, natural disaster, war, poverty) and enabling parents to feed their children, children to attend school, and families to feel nurtured and full.

My heart remains full of gratitude for all that we did together on the 20th. That day really symbolizes who Willow Creek is:

- Ready to serve: As soon as we walked downstairs from worship, you put on gloves and hair nets and got to work! Certainly this is who you are, following the light of Christ out of the sanctuary and into the world, and seeking opportunities to be the light of Christ for others.
- Committed to our traditions: we love our hymns, our liturgy, our beautiful and historic sanctuary, our favorite organ and handbell pieces, our familiar rhythm of doing things from worship to marking the seasons.
- Willing to try something new: but we do not love our traditions so much that we are trapped by them. You are willing to follow where the Spirit of God is leading and try new things

I'm grateful we were willing to try something new, and I've loved hearing how meaningful this experience was. Sometimes, the Spirit leads us to try new things that stick - and, sometimes, we learn that there are

other opportunities ahead of us to try next time. I'm always eager to hear what a new experience was like for you, so we can learn together as we listen to where God is leading us. Much like our Mission Closet, trying something new while remaining rooted in tradition is a posture of making ourselves available to where the Spirit of God may lead us.

In this Advent season of anticipation, we open ourselves to where the Spirit of God is leading, by walking the traditional, familiar path of beloved stories, carols and traditions. But we walk that path expecting it to feel different this year, expecting to meet God in a new and different way at the same old manger under the same old star.

Bank Draft A Bank Draft is an easy way to give monthly. Many of our members have chosen this method. Several advantages include: no church weekly giving envelopes, no need to write checks, no handling by the Church Financial Secretaries & there are no fees. Please contact our bookkeeper Diane Van Vleet at the church for assistance to set up a bank draft.

Online Giving Through the website: willowcreekpc.org, click on the "Giving" or "Make a Donation" tab and follow the instructions. This is a very simple method to give. There is a 2% fee per dollar amount on each transaction. On a gift of \$50 the fee would be \$1. If this is a recurring gift, and you would like to avoid the fees the church pays you may want to consider a bank draft.

Church Envelopes This is a traditional method of giving. Church envelopes are generated for you and used to give weekly gifts. If you wish to receive or discontinue receiving a box of envelopes, please notify the church office.
