Dear Willow Creek Church Family,

Over a year ago, our amazing media team (Mike Landi, Annie Picken and David Perez Fernandez) made a request for their workspace to be updated. As soon as they asked, we thought: of course changes should be made! Technology and our congregation's needs have changed drastically since the current sound table was installed. The team has grown - because the job has grown. More space is certainly needed.

The team brought their ideas to the Buildings and Grounds committee, and these two groups of hard-working, committed, talented people collaborated to come up with a plan for a new recording platform. This platform will allow the media team to have a better view of the whole sanctuary as well as ensure that they can be more comfortable while they do their important work. An expanded workspace will allow for more volunteers to become involved with this ministry, and will ensure that we can more easily upgrade our technology as needed.

Session agreed that this work was necessary, and to clear the way for the process, approved of the removal of up to two pews from the back of the sanctuary.

We plan for these pews to be removed sometime this spring to make space for the new platform. Things will look different when you walk in our beloved sanctuary. That might feel exciting – an average of 50 folks watch our service online each week (with the views increasing to more than 100 on special Sundays like Easter). Especially since most churches spent a portion of 2020 solely worshiping online, a lot of people continue to choose to worship in that way. Some of our online worshipers are folks who used to worship regularly in person, but health concerns have made that no longer possible. We are grateful for them faithfully tuning in each week and the reminder that God's church is never restricted to the sanctuary.

The changes in the sanctuary might feel something besides exciting – there might be sadness with those changes; there might be some annoyance. All of those feelings are ok. While I wish no one ever felt anything negative about changes we make as a church, that's simply not available. You're entitled to feel whatever it feels like when you walk in and see missing pews. I'm sure my own feelings about it will be mixed.

But these are the things I hold on to:

• Gratitude for being Presbyterian - in the Presbyterian church, big decisions are never made by one individual. This decision was made by not one but *two* committees bringing a proposal to Session, who then discussed it at length before voting. It wasn't an easy decision, but I trust the folks who made it because they are the ones God has called to lead our congregation at this time.

- The motivation for these changes is the ongoing commitment to make sure worship is accessible for all and to make sure the online worship experience is as excellent as possible. These are good concerns from the media committee. And then, the guys who work the hardest to ensure our church remains beautiful and functional our Buildings and Grounds committee are the ones who are overseeing this project. While we all love the beauty of our sanctuary, they are most invested in maintaining it. I trust the motivations and judgements of everyone on these two committees.
- God's church will always persist no one loves the church more than God, and while our steps forward as we follow God's leading might feel uncomfortable at times, we place our trust in and are comforted by the One who has proved faithful in the past, is present with us now, and who knows our future.

We welcome any questions from the congregation about these positive changes to support our shared ministry. There will be a **Q&A** opportunity during **Fellowship Hour on Sunday**, **February 19th** in the back of the Sanctuary. Representatives from the Media Committee and the Buildings and Grounds Committee (David Perez Fernandez, Annie Picken and John Reid) will be present to describe the coming changes and answer any questions you may have.

Finally, we will need to find new homes for the pews that are removed. If you have any interest in a pew or any ideas of what can be done with them, please let me know!

**Lent** begins with **Ash Wednesday on February 22nd**. On Ash Wednesday, we will offer "drive through" ashes in the parking lot from **9am - 9:30am and 5pm - 5:30pm**. The **sanctuary will be open all day for contemplation and prayer**. Stations will be set up throughout the sanctuary to invite worshippers into the season of Lent with activities that help us focus on God's presence. These activities are designed for all ages (and so, it may not be a silent space if younger worshipers are present!).



**Ash Wednesday worship is at 6pm.** This is a simple service that includes an opportunity to receive the imposition of ashes.

During this holy season, we will focus on Scripture's "Bread Stories". We will walk toward the cross accompanied by stories of God providing sustenance for our journeys. The "bread story" that is preached on each Sunday will be the

focus of our discussion at our **Wednesday evening Lenten Soup (and Bread!) Study**. We meet at **5:30pm** for a simple shared meal, fellowship and study. You do not have to come each week – choose which stories are most interesting to you, or come when your schedule allows! We will meet on **Wednesdays in March (1st, 8th, 15th, 22nd and 29th) from 5:30pm - 7pm.** 

For **adult Sunday school during Lent** we will discuss the **Lenten devotional**. This year's devotional is focused on the beloved hymn **Amazing Grace**, which is 250 years old this year! We meet on **Sundays at 9am** in the Library.

## A NOTE FROM GENE WHEELER:

I am writing to inform everyone of my heart issues and what is pending. My doctors have given me a very thorough exam - they even went in and looked at all the bypasses I had done in 2001. The report is that all my previous surgeries are in good condition.

But, they are concerned that my heart murmur (which is a birth defect), is now my biggest problem. When the heart forces blood to my lungs, the valve does not function properly. A big percent of the blood returns back into my heart. The big risk is blood clots, and I need a procedure to fix it.

This operation will be done in Janesville. After a couple more consultations, the surgery will be scheduled. Until that happens, I need to stay healthy and not get Covid.
