Dear Willow Creek Church Family,

Last night at our Lenten Soup Study, we went around the table and each person shared their own description of what happens when we celebrate Communion. This question came from our study of John 6:1-14, when Jesus feeds the multitude with five small barley loaves and two small fish. Just before Jesus distributes the bread, he gives thanks for it, and giving thanks is something we always do when we celebrate the Sacrament of Communion.

These are some of the descriptions of what happens at the communion table folks gave last night: fresh start, ritual, community, sacrifice, broken, poured out, feeding, celebration, salvation, remembering that Christ died.

We agreed that no one answer is sufficient - that we need all of these ideas to try to make sense of what's happening at the Communion table. The sacraments are a divine mystery. They're an opportunity for us to touch something very "earthy", very common: water in Baptism, bread and cup in Communion. But the common thing is always set apart in the sacrament for a holy use. St. Augustine wrote that the sacraments are "visible signs of invisible grace." I love this quote not only because it centers us on grace, but also because it reveals that even a great, prolific theologian struggled to make sense of what happens at the table and the font.

So much of our lives of faith are played out in this very space: where we are holding something common and suddenly become aware that it represents something holy. Whether it is the elements of the sacraments in our hands or something else – a tool we use for our work, a hand of a loved one that we hold, an instrument that you make music with, a book that connects you with another's way of thinking, a vegetable that is being transformed into a meal, a leaf that promises spring. The ritual of our sacraments reminds us that every common thing can become sacred and that divinity is present in each one of us.

Each week of Lent we have explored a different "bread story" – a different moment in scripture when a common food became the message of divine presence and provision. My hope as we complete our lenten journey and turn our hearts toward the season of Easter is that we can carry this "sacramental" way of seeing, touching and tasting with us. Where might we experience God when we remember to give thanks for the common things that we touch?
