

A NOTE FROM PASTOR LAUREN The beginning of a New Year is an opportunity to imagine what is on the horizon - what God is making new here and now, and how we are being called to participate?

It's also an opportunity to reflect on what will never change: God's love for us, God's abundant grace, and God's call to love our neighbor as ourselves. Those truths have rooted a community of faith here in this place for 180 years.

Our church was organized at the end of 1844, with a group of faithful Scottish Presbyterians and a local minister. I've always found it curious that they organized in the dead of winter. Perhaps they needed something hopeful to warm their souls as snow piled up, making chores and living difficult.

In January of 1845, they celebrated their First Communion, which is the final act that officially organizes a newly chartered church.

As we mark a new year as individuals and as a church, we reflect with gratitude on the permanence of these old brick walls. We know that buildings are not actually permanent, and neither are churches, for that matter. But the Church of Jesus Christ is permanent, and as long as we continue to seek the will of God and the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, there is no reason to wonder how many more New Years Willow Creek will celebrate. The faithful have gathered in this place and broken bread together - at the Communion table and at tables of celebration and fellowship as well as tables where the mourning are gathered - for generations now. May we continue to do so. With gratitude, we chalk these lovely sanctuary doors and prepare for another year of welcoming friends and strangers who will become friends.

In the bleak midwinter 180 years ago, warmed by the love of God and the fellowship of friends and family, and the Holy Spirit and perhaps some other spirits – they were Scottish, after all – a group of faithful Presbyterians planted roots so that this community would be a place where the cold might always find warmth. We honor their legacy and our shared faith by persisting in the mission of loving God and neighbor here and now. We greet another New Year with consideration for our past and resolve for our future.

<u>CHALKING OF THE DOORS</u> You are invited to take chalk home with you and join the ancient practice of chalking your doors for the New Year with CMB + 2025. The letters CMB stand for the names of the magi (Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar) or the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat* (Christ bless this house). Here is a blessing as you chalk your doors:

God of doors and homes, bless this home this year and every year. Bless all who come and go through this door, both those who live here and those who visit. May all who enter through this door come in peace and bring joy. May all who come to this door find welcome and love. May the love and joy in this home overflow and spread into the community and the world. And may Jesus Christ watch over us all. Amen.
