ADVENT WREATH CANDLE LIGHTING: JOY

Two weeks ago we lit the candle of hope, a reminder to offer hope to others in any way we can while always looking forward with hope to the fulfillment of the promises from the days of old. Then, last week, we lit the candle of peace, a reminder that the way of Christ is the way of peace: a way of humility and confessing our need for God and others.

Are we still waiting on the fulfillment of the promises of hope and peace?

Yes - we don't know how long the wait will be, but we are still waiting. The waiting started long ago. Our ancient ancestors in the faith waited on the Messiah, the One the prophets promised would be in our midst, a warrior who gives victory, rejoices over us with gladness, renews us in love and exults over us with loud singing.

But didn't the Messiah come? Isn't Jesus the One who rejoices over us and renews us?

Yes! That's what we celebrate at Advent - that Christ came and fulfilled the promises *and* Christ made more promises that are still lingering. Some have already come true, while some have not yet come true.

That's a strange kind of waiting.

It is! But we wait in joy, because we reflect on all that God has done since the days of old. And even while we look forward to the promise of peace, hope and joy we get to experience peace, hope and joy.

We get to experience the promises fulfilled before they're actually fulfilled?

Yes! In those indelibly joyful moments that we especially experience during this season - the laughter of loved ones, the delight of giving gifts to others in celebration of the best gift ever given, and the warmth of a kitchen that smells like memories and promises as favorite recipes are re-created.

We light this candle of joy as a reminder to look for those already moments, while we look forward with hope, peace and joy to the promises that are not yet fulfilled. Come, let us worship God!

O Antiphons comes from the Greek word antiphon (ἀντίφωνον, ἀντί "opposite" and φωνή "voice"), which is a short chant sung as a refrain. The antiphons were designed to concentrate the mind on Advent with a complex series of references from the Old and New Testaments. In Latin, the first letters of these seven images of Christ - Sapientia (wisdom), Adonia (Lord), Radix Jesse (root of Jesse), Clavis David (Key of David), Oriens (Radiant Dawn), Rex Gentium (Ruler of the nations), Emmanuel (God with us) - make up a backward acrostic, spelling ero cras: "tomorrow I will [come]." We are most familiar with these seven images from the hymn O Come, O Come, Emmanuel. By reciting them, we are lifting our hearts and voices in an Advent tradition that dates back to the 8th century. With the prayerful refrain "Come..." we confess our belief that Christ has come and Christ will come again, and we describe the One whose return we anticipate.
