A NOTE FROM PASTOR LAUREN This Lent, we have journeyed to Jerusalem with Jesus, pausing to listen to the parables that comforted and challenged his followers along the way. Those first disciples found Christ irresistibly compelling – they just kept following him, no matter how strange things became. They kept asking questions, even though the answers were often confusing. They kept walking after him, getting dustier and dustier.

A Rabbi being followed by his disciples was a common scene in the ancient world. This is how learning happened: following, listening, discerning, emulating. Discipleship was much like apprenticeship. Rabbis shared their lives with their followers - they broke bread together, found shelter together, and witnessed God's movement in the world together. Very committed students were described as "covered in the dust" of their rabbi, because they followed so closely that the dust of the road would be picked up from their teacher's sandals and cover them.

As we follow the ancient Lenten path in Jesus' footsteps and approach Good Friday's cross, I think of how our journey began, on Ash Wednesday, with: "You are dust, and to dust you shall return." What does it mean if we begin as dust, and get covered in dust along the way, and return to dust at the end? What does it mean that Jesus' ministry was so dusty: dirty, earthy, rooted in the soil of this world, and somehow entirely otherworldly? How dusty can we get as we follow the one who was, who is, and who is to come?

In attendance were: Pastor Lauren Patrus-Betzel (Moderator), Karli Rankin, Katherine Ralston, Rebekah Landi (Clerk), Tom Andrew, Molly Shipton, and Pat Nortch. Lon Clark, Jeff Cummings, and Cindy Nelson were excused. A quorum was declared. The following actions were taken:

- 1. Consent agenda was received and approved as stated.
- 2. A motion was made and seconded to move the money from Gifts and Bequests account into a business checking account at Rockford Community Bank. An amendment to the motion was made to empower the finance committee to invest the money into CDs when they determine the interest rates are favorable. The motion with the amendment passed.
- 3. A motion was made and seconded to schedule 1-2 CPR trainings with a cost of \$20 per participant, prioritizing training preschool and nursery staff. The motion passed.
- 4. A motion was made to approve the request for building use on April 26, 2025 for the Farm Bureau painting party. It was seconded and the motion passed.
- 5. A motion was made and seconded to approve preschool playdates at church with Lauren supervising. The motion passed.
- 6. A motion was made and seconded to approve using the \$300 that we use for the mission each month be used for the 4 Special Offerings from March, May, October and November. The motion passed.
- 7. A motion was made and seconded that until the Bed Build, Change for Change funds would go to the Bed Build costs. After the Bed Build, Change for Change funds should go to our Family in Need Fund. The motion passed.
- 8. A motion was made and seconded to empower the Deacons to create a cookbook. The funds raised will go into the Deacon's budget. The motion passed.
- 9. A motion was made and seconded to use Carol Lyford's memorial fund for the preschool laptop and Pat and Gordon Bindenagel and Loren Buffington's memorial funds for the office computers and necessary equipment. The motion passed.
