A NOTE FROM PASTOR LAUREN The cross of Christ's crucifixion is central to our Christian faith. And yet, how would you describe what the cross means? My guess is there are as many different answers to that as there are people reading this! At first glance, it's somewhat simple: the cross tells us that God loves us. But how - and why - is this awful thing a symbol of God's love?

Some of our beloved hymns reveal the different approaches to understanding the cross. Is it an *old rugged* cross that we cling to? Or a *cross lifted high* triumphantly proclaiming the love of the victorious Lamb? We are invited to look at the cross from different perspectives, to see it in as many different ways as possible, in an attempt to seek a greater understanding of God's grace, mercy, love, justice and righteousness. Ultimately, we confess that somehow the cross is integral to atonement: God reconciling us so that we are one with God.

Often, after Easter Sunday, the lectionary (and the preacher!) turn quickly away from the cross and focus on how the early church was woven together by the Holy Spirit. Scottish theologian Thomas Smail wrote this: "There is no way to Pentecost, except by Calvary; the Spirit is given from the cross." We are on our way from Calvary to Pentecost - from Easter to the Birthday of the Church - and we are lingering in these hopeful weeks over the mystery of how God's great love came into the world, defeated death, and provided salvation. Join us the next few weeks for our **Wondrous Cross** sermon series as we remain beneath the Cross of Jesus.

<u>PER CAPITA</u> is how Presbyterians share equally, responsibly, and interdependently in the costs of governing the Presbyterian Church (USA). Per capita is: the major funding source for the Presbytery, requested from every congregation, based on total active membership of each church, and paid by the Presbytery to the Synod of Lincoln Trails & General Assembly regardless of what we actually collect. As a connectional church, Presbyterian congregations worship, serve, and govern together. Per capita contributions fund the shared governing responsibilities for the whole church.

The Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly each set per capita based on their annual budgets and the number of active members in the churches of each organization. Each church is encouraged to give its full requested share of per capita so that the Presbytery of Blackhawk is able to support congregations and care for pastors. For 2025, per capita is \$44.00 per church member. Please indicate "per capita" on your envelope or check memo.
